Various members continued to offer comments on the negative impacts of of Bill 23.

Board member commented on how the budget will be affected should the bill be passed.

Asked about comments from MPP Todd Smith, staff member spoke a week ago to him, and has bypassed all questions about Bill 23.

Board member offered that all counsellors/ board members share the same sentiment and support the CA's and vow to help fight the bill.

Board member asked about a template letter to share with municipalities as a way to offer comment.
