Depot Lakes Conservation Area is nestled in the heart of the Land o' Lakes tourist region, just north of the village of Verona.

This Conservation Area is 1,214 hectares (3,000 acres) in size and is made up of Second, Third, and Fourth Depot Lakes. Launch your boat at any one of the Lakes, and take advantage of some of the best fishing in Eastern Ontario.


This is our only Conservation Area that offers camping, featuring 54 seasonal sites, many of them waterfront, as well as 20 interior sites along the shoreline and on a few

of the tiny islands of Second Depot Lake. A boat, canoe, or kayak is required to access interior sites.

Day Use activities include hiking and paddling. There are approximately 9 km of hiking trails that traverse through the Canadian Shield. Hikers should be aware that the terrain is rugged and appropriate footwear is required.

On the trail, you may see deer, moose, black bears, a variety of bird species, and many other small creatures. The hiking trails begin on the west side of the Seasonal Campground, about 1 km from the main gate.

INTERIOR CAMPING

Enjoy a back country camping experience at one of our 20 interior campsites.

You can book campsites online from Victoria Day weekend to the end of September at depotlakes.ca. The online reservation system opens each year at the beginning of March.

- All campsites are boat-in only. You must have a boat on your campsite for safety reasons.
- Persons must be 19 years of age to register for a campsite. Proof of age will be required.
- The minimum booking period is 2 nights.
- No more than 6 people can occupy a campsite unless these people comprise a single-family unit consisting of parents and their children.
- Paid parking is in place.

- Each campsite has a picnic table, fire pit, and an outdoor privy.
- Drinking water is available. Please bring refillable water containers and help reduce waste at the campground.
- Toilet paper is not provided for the campsites.
- No glass bottles are allowed on interior campsites.
- There is a maximum of two pets per campsite; owners must pick up after their pets. No pets are allowed in designated swimming or beach areas. All pets are to be on a leash not exceeding 6 feet and kept under control.
- Fires are permitted in designated areas only and must be contained within the designated fire pit.
 When finished, all fire pits must be soaked with water. Fires will not be permitted if a fire ban is in effect for the region. Firewood is not available to purchase.



SEASONAL CAMPSITES

Seasonal campsites are available for rent from Victoria Day weekend to the end of September.

- Each site has drive-in access and a fire pit.
- The campground includes shower facilities and a drinking water refill station.
- Hydro, water and sewage hook up is not provided.
- Our seasonal sites are based on first come, first served and subject to availability.
- All trailers must be insured, road worthy, and removed from the campground at the end of the season.

Quinte Conservation enforces *O. Reg. 688/21 Rules of Conduct in Conservation Areas* under the *Conservation Authorities Act*, as well as a Zero Tolerance Policy.

DAY USE

Depot Lakes is open to visitors for day use activities such as picnicking, swimming, hiking, and boating. Depot Lakes is a wilderness experience and visitors may encounter different types of wildlife.

There is a daily parking rate for those who are not annual pass holders. Learn more at quinteconservation.ca/outdoor-spaces/parking/.

The trails at Depot Lakes are closed mid-October to mid-November each year during hunting season.
